



Special Event Liquor License for Roots N Boots

Background

- The Town holds a government license to sell and serve alcohol at HPEC.
- FOHP would like to obtain a Series 15 Special Event Liquor License.
- Series 15 license is a temporary liquor license that allows a charitable organization to sell/serve alcohol.



Background

- Qualifying organizations will be granted a special event license for the term of the event.
- The qualified organization must receive at least 25% of the gross revenues.
- FOHP needs the Town's approval to submit the application.



Benefits

- FOHP would be operating under their license – not the Town license.
- FOHP would be required to purchase their own liquor liability insurance and name the Town as additional insured.
- This opportunity creates potential for higher revenues to FOHP.



Sales Plan


- All patrons will go through identification check and issued a wrist band (21 and over)
- Wrist band will allow patron to purchase tickets for alcoholic drinks.
- Tickets will be presented to professional bartender for service.
- Drinks will be served throughout the rodeo performances; however sales will cease approximately one hour before the end of each performance.
- A designated, secured area has been established for alcohol sales.



Security

- FOHP is working with MCSO to finalize the security plan.
- MCSO will provide off-duty officers, crime prevention posse and mounted posse members.
- Professional bartenders will be hired to serve the drinks.
- E-Staff, a private security firm, is very experienced with large events.
- A designated area has been established for all alcohol service; exit/entry points will be monitored.
