- If feasible, type of incubator
- Best practices
- Incubator strength and weaknesses

FINDINGS

- A well designed, fairly valued (rental rate) service oriented office space would be most beneficial
- Convert the water company space
- Secure the Queen Creek Chamber of Commerce as an anchor tenant

- Job creation potential
