



Background

- The ADOT Passenger Rail Corridor Study is evaluating 7 rail and bus alternatives for a rapid transit system between Phoenix and Tucson
- Public hearings and presentations to review option last fall
- Council presentation on Dec. 5 and letter from Town to ADOT on Dec. 12 supporting the YELLOW and TEAL route alternatives
- Alternatives serve Queen Creek, but also rated highest on the MAG commuter rail study
- Second evaluation of alternatives completed following public input



Passenger Rail Corridor Study Project Status






Seven Initial Alternatives




Public Route Alternative Preferences






Agency Route Alternative Preferences



Next Steps

- ADOT April 23 meeting begin narrowing to two route alternatives
- Selection of two routes for further review
- Preparation of the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS)
- Public Comment period (fall 2013)
- Final EIS published (winter 2013)
- Secure project funding there is currently no construction funding available



Staff Recommendation

- Council approve Resolution 941-13 endorsing the YELLOW and TEAL route alternatives
- Submit the Resolution to ADOT
- Staff and Council to promote use of the YELLOW and TEAL alternatives
- Coordinate our efforts with Gilbert (who also supports the yellow and teal alternatives)
