#### B: Update and Discussion on Queen Creek Local Transit Feasibility Study

Alec More of Valley Metro gave a brief presentation of the results of the recent community travel survey that yielded the following results.

- o There were 260 total survey responses from Queen Creek Residents
- Residents of Queen Creek have a 2:1 average that favors Downtown Phoenix as the major destination for work. Second favoring Mesa.
- o Top 5 Likely Destinations for Queen Creek residents where Phoenix-Mesa Gateway Airport (72.9%), Superstition Springs Mall (66.8%), Other Destinations around the Valley (64.5%), Work outside Queen Creek (62.6%), and Local Shopping Centers (57.3%).
- It was identified that the majority of Employment in Queen Creek is focused in northern and western areas.
- Respondents desire expedient, point-to-point service to downtown Phoenix
- Respondents indicated a stronger desire for connections to greater transit networks and access to Valley destinations via transit
- o Light/Commuter Rail was the most preferred mode of transit transportation (78%)
- Commuter rail and park-in-ride facilities would offer present and future Queen Creek residents a valuable service

<u>Action</u>: None.

**C:** Discussion and Possible action on Ellsworth Road from Rittenhouse to Queen Creek Road Troy White, Public Works Division Manager, presented with Kevin Roberts from Dibble Engineering two possible access right of way design concepts for Ellsworth Road.

- Design Concept #1: Single Lane in each direction from Ellsworth Loop Rd to Rittenhouse Road. Barns Parkway controlled by 4 way stop. North of Barnes Park way there is a dedicated right turn lane purposed into Bridges Preschool. A Cul-desac was identified in front of the San Tan Historical Society.
- Design Concept #2: Single Lane in each direction from Ellsworth Loop Rd to
  Rittenhouse Road. Barns Parkway controlled by a Round-a-bout. North of Barnes
  Park way there is a dedicated right turn lane to access Old Ellsworth Road. A Cul-desac was identified in front of the San Tan Historical Society.
- o The Committee also wanted to maintain on street parking in this area

Discussion centered on the possible negative impacts of each design concept. Including, decreasing traffic on Barnes Parkway.
