**1. Call to Order**

The meeting was called to order at 5:30pm.

**2. Roll Call**

**4. Discussion** on the findings of the Solid Waste Study.

Public Works Director Don Noble gave an overview of the Task Force and solid waste study. He then introduced Scott Pasternak of R.W. Beck, the Town's consultant.

Mr. Pasternak gave a presentation on the solid waste study (see study attached).

After the presentation, Council had several questions and concerns:

- Would dumpster be provided for use on large lots? Mr. Pasternak said that this could be included in the bid documents.
- Are commercial services provided? Mr. Pasternak responded that commercial services were excluded from the study but could also be included in bid documents.

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- Frequency of twice a week pick-up – would this actually be reduced pick-up service with one pick-up being for recyclable? Mr. Pasternak explained that much of the residential garbage is recyclable and regular waste/garbage would be reduced. He also said that an additional garbage can could be available at an additional charge. Mr. Pasternak said this also could be included in bid documents.
- Could commercial service be provided by the same provider?
- What staff time would be required to provide public outreach? Public Works and Marketing & Communications would determine.

**5. Presentation and discussion** on a proposed work plan for a sub-committee of the Economic Development Commission to develop and promote partnerships, programs and guidelines that will advance the Arts, Culture and Experiences sector identified in the Economic Development Strategic Plan.
