





Arizona Expenditure Limitation -Home Rule Option Renewal

Town Council Meeting December 20, 2017



BACKGROUND

- Enacted in 1979/80 by State
 Legislature to Limit Local Government
 Spending
 - Property Taxes were Increasing at a Greater Rate than Personal Incomes
- Local Options Exist to Override Limit
 - 1. Home Rule
 - 2. Permanent Base Adjustment



HOME RULE

- Voter Approval Required
 - Current Authorization Expires in FY 2018-19
- Effective for Four Years
 - FY 2019-20 to FY 2022-23
- Expenditure Limit is the Adopted Budget
- Town's Approach Since Incorporation
 - Last Election (2014): 73% Voter Approval

HOME RULE – BY THE NUMBERS



The Town Could Not Provide Existing Services Without Home Rule \$150M Reduction Required

Fiscal Year	Home Rule Expenditure Limit (Budget)	Actual Expenditures	Expenditure Limit Without Home Rule**	Reduction Amount
2015/16	\$154.5	\$95.5	\$29.6	(\$65.9)
2016/17	\$184.1	\$182.5*	\$32.1	(\$150.4)*

^{** 1978-79} Base Year Increased for population and inflation factors less allowable deductions (i.e. Debt Service)




RENEWAL IS CRITICAL

- Requires a 2/3 Town Council Vote to be Placed on the Ballot
- Unable to Provide Current Services to Existing Residents and Businesses and Future Residents and Businesses
 - \$150M Expenditure Reduction Required
- Infrastructure Spending Would be Inadequate
- Not About Revenues They Remain Unchanged







 - eNewsletter




FINAL PUSH (AUGUST)

 - Chamber Newsletter




PERMANENT BASE ADJUSTMENT

- Voter Approval Required
- Sets Actual Amount
- Amount Readjusted Annually for Inflation and Population
- Example Cities
 - Gilbert
 - Scottsdale
 - Tempe



RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. Seek Home Rule Election in August 2018
- 2. During the 4-Year Renewal Period, Consider Permanent Base Adjustment
 - 2020 Primary Election
 - FY 2023/24 Effective Date
 - Long-Term Solution
