Consideration and possible approval of FY 2019/20 budget amendments to increase state-shared revenue estimates by \$432,446 (due to final state budget appropriations pertaining to the Highway User Revenue Fund); amend CIP and debt funding transfers; and decrease debt service expenses by \$1.25 million, with an offsetting increase to contingency in the CIP budget resulting in no change to the overall expenditure budget.
