A. Public Hearing and possible action on P20-0003 Desert Horizon Nursery Conditional Use Permit Time Extension, a request by John Reddell for renewal of the previously granted Conditional Use Permit to allow continued operation of the existing Desert Horizon Nursery, located north of the northwest corner of Ellsworth and Ryan roads.

The public hearing was opened. No comments were received by the public and the public hearing was closed.

 - A. Discussion and possible action on Ordinance 721-20, P20-0042 Town Code Text Amendment, Vicious Animals a staff initiated text amendment to revise Section 6-2-1 Definitions and Section 6-2-9 Dogs Not Permitted at Large; Wearing License of Chapter 6 of the Town Code.

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Erik Swanson, Interim Planning Administrator briefly outlined the two proposed changes to the Town Code text amendment regarding vicious animals.

- 1. The definition of vicious animals was changed to define a vicious animal as an animal that bites, scratches or otherwise inflicts an injury on a human being <u>or animal</u>. He explained that our current code only applies to injuries to humans.
- 2. Add a subsection that prohibits a vicious animal to be without a leash in a Queen Creek dog park.

Victor Martinez, Code Compliance Supervisor and MCSO Captain Greg Lugo were present to answer questions if needed.

Queen Creek resident Robert Milk spoke in favor of the item. He reported on a tragic incident where his wife was injured and his dog was killed by a vicious animal. Mr. Milk asked the Council to strengthen the language in the Town Code so as to prevent such an attack to another person and/or animal.

Council expressed their condolences to the Milks and engaged in discussion on vicious animals.

Council Member Hoffman asked about the enforcement of vicious attacks under the existing code compared to enforcement with the proposed changes.

Code Compliance Supervisor Victor Martinez explained that the changes will include an animal biting another animal, and added that the enforcement goes through Gilbert Municipal Court under our IGA with Town of Gilbert.

Mr. Swanson said the changes will clarify the current code to include attacks on other animals and not just people.

Council Member Hoffman expressed his concerns on expanding the code and creating more laws, as well as scenarios where pet owners may be criminalized for the actions of their pet if their dog scratches another dog with the way the new code is written. He stated that the current code, when enforced correctly, provides protection to humans.

No votes taken due to continuing discussions and alternative motions.

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Discussion on the motion took place. Council Member Hoffman asked about the extent of enforcement that could be levied on a pet owner.

Mr. Martinez said the judge makes the determination on fines. Town Attorney Scott Holcomb provided information on the level of penalty for first time and repeat offenders and said it is determined by the Judge.

Mr. Hoffman asked the Town Attorney if they could direct staff to modify the text amendment. Council had additional discussion on enforcement, fines and decriminalization.

Attorney Holcomb said that Council could direct staff to modify the text amendment to make the determination that an attack on another animal is not criminalized. He provided clarification about the determination of a vicious animal, and said it has to be made by the Justice of the Peace or Town Magistrate.


