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




### Refresher on Proposition 400

- In 2004, Maricopa County voters approved Proposition 400, a half cent sales tax dedicated to transportation needs in the Valley.
- MAG, as the Regional Planning agency, is responsible for the implementation and execution of the regional transportation plan associated with Proposition 400.
- Proposition 400 is set to expire in 2025 and was a 20-year initiative.



# **New Capacity 1/2 Cent**











#### What does this mean for Queen Creek?

- Freeway needs met: SR-24 full construction to Ironwood is included in all scenarios for a total of \$105 million
  - Full interchanges at Signal Butte, Meridian & Ironwood
- Minimum of 9 guaranteed QC arterial projects:
  - Totaling: \$119 million
  - Regional Funding: \$83.6 million
- Out of 33 regionally-significant arterial projects, here's how they would fall under each scenario (in regional dollars):

New Capacity ½ Cent	System Optimization ½ cent*	New Capacity 1 cent	System Optimization 1 cent
11 projects (+\$26 million)	9 projects (\$83.6 million- baseline)	25 projects + commuter rail (+\$183.8 million)	11 projects (+\$7.3 million)
