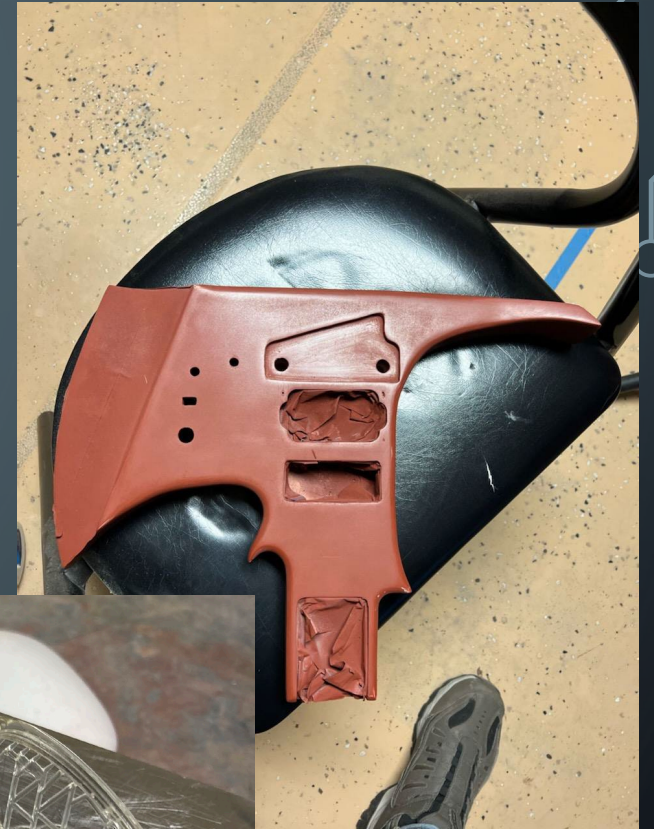
COMMUNITY CONNECTIONS

NEW AND UPCOMING

Guy and Lisa are working on version 1 of “Dan G.”, their robot dog (which will be 3D printed in a much larger scale). Dan uses facial recognition to find Lisa or Guy and will be able to map the building and find his way to his bed where he will wirelessly charge.

Lisa and Guy made this 7.5’ tall 3D printed Azog the Defiler statue from The Hobbit. They are also prototyping large scale print packages featuring Naruto, Pokemon and other favorites.

We are also working with some new homeschoolers in building a metal forge, robots, learning Python, and of course cosplay.
