GOALS & OBJECTIVES

The achievement of the Town's goals is best accomplished through active community involvement.

- Initiate a volunteer program for the Town offering opportunities for civic engagement throughout the year, collaboratively across all Town departments.
- 2. Increase the current capacity of individual and group volunteer involvement by 100% in the first year to best support Town staff in providing community programs, services and events.
- 3. Strategically conduct outreach to ensure that volunteers reflect the diversity of the Queen Creek community.

Service Requirements

For a volunteer to be considered 'active,' they are asked to contribute 48 or more hours annually (calendar year) to the Town. The benefit of remaining on 'active' status, is that they will qualify for service pins and invited to the annual volunteer appreciation dinner.

Volunteers who do not contribute 48 or more hours annually to the Town, will still be recognized, however, they will not qualify for service pins nor the annual volunteer appreciation dinner.

2022 data & strategy for moving forward

- an estimated 323

 events volunteers

 contributed 1, 780 hours
- plus numerous sports leagues contributed 82,176 hours
- Assisted community members young and old and provided vital support to Town staff

In 2022, the National Value of Each Volunteer Hour was \$29.95. Thus a total benefit to taxpayers of \$2,514,482 (83,956 hours x \$29.95).

Current focus is to increase 323 volunteers to 646 with a contribution of 3,560 hours (100% increase in the first year).
