# PROCLAMATION

**WHEREAS**, lives are put at risk and substantial property damage is caused by rapidly developing severe thunderstorms, flash floods and lightning strikes; and

**WHEREAS**, each year public safety personnel put their lives at risk to rescue citizens who become victims of severe thunderstorms, flash floods and lightning strikes; and

**WHEREAS**, the residents of Queen Creek and visitors to our community should take proper precautions to protect themselves from these hazards and heed safety warnings during severe weather; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Queen Creek joins the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's National Weather Service, along with local law enforcement agencies, and fire departments in recognizing the need to educate all citizens on how to properly respond when severe thunderstorms and flash floods strike our town.




## Southwest Monsoon Awareness Week
