Update on the Small Area Transportation Study, State Route 24 extension & Central Arizona Pkwy Mohamed Youssef, Public Works Director, presented the findings of second Small Area Transportation Study that included SR 24 extension, and Central Arizona Parkway. The study unequivocally revealed that without SR 24 and Central Arizona Parkway, the existing street network within the study area would fail to meet the acceptable level of service required for smooth operation and efficiency.
- E. Presentation on MAG Superstition Vistas Multimodal Transportation Planning Study
 Mohamed Youssef, Public Works Director, delivered a brief presentation on the MAG Superstition
 Vistas Multimodal Transportation Planning Study (SVMTPS) seeks to create a coordinated vision for a
 multimodal transportation network that enhances accessibility and mobility for people and goods
 within the study area. The study considers both near-term (2030) and long-range (2050) goals to
 develop an efficient and interconnected transportation system spanning multiple jurisdictions. By
 integrating various modes of transportation, the SVMTPS aims to promote seamless movement and
 facilitate the effective transportation of individuals and goods throughout the region.

Presentation on Queen Creek Rd and Hawes Rd intersection design options Mohamed Youssef, Public Works Director, delivered a brief presentation on the Queen Creek Mobility Options and Connectivity Feasibility Study. This comprehensive study delves deep into the exploration of cutting-edge strategies aimed at enhancing connectivity for our valued residents and broadening the scope of transportation options within our community.
