    - 2. Axon Subscription Services and Equipment Purchases: Additional spending authority of \$50,000. The Council approved \$325,000 on June 7, 2023. This will take the total authorized spending authority to \$375,000 (Police)
  - D. Consideration and possible approval of a budget adjustment of \$137,134 from grant contingency for personnel costs and training related to a grant from the Arizona Department of Emergency and Military Affairs that has been previously approved and is continuing into FY 2023-24.
