Overarching Goals

- Represent the Town's vision, mission and values.
- Encourage other levels of government to work collaboratively with cities and towns on issues of mutual interest.
- Protect local funding and self-determination, as well as enhance opportunities to improve the Town's economic sustainability and provide for necessary infrastructure development.
- Advocate for access to availability of secure, long-term sustainable and fiscally responsible water resources for the current and future growth of the community.
- Promote economic development opportunities in partnership with the State.











Objectives

- Protect local funding
- Ensure adequate funding of state agencies for state services
- Maintain local self-determination and oppose unfunded mandates
- Evaluate construction sales tax reform in conjunction with the League of Arizona Cities and Towns' Task Force recommendations
- Reduce unfunded pension liabilities and balance fiscal constraints with benefits provided to employees
- Promote economic development opportunities in partnership with the State
- Preserve funding for the Maricopa County Library District
- Support transportation improvements and associated funding
- Support policies that provide access to secure, long-term sustainable and fiscally responsible water resources that contribute to an assured water supply











Major Changes from 2023

- Included opposition to the shifting of Arizona Highway User Revenue Funds to fund the Arizona Department of Public Safety.
- Added language to the housing/zoning policy statements that we continue to maintain the right to determine key design aesthetics/standards that determine the look and feel of the community and are committed to further process improvements and efficiencies.
- Added language that we support opportunities for the expansion of the Queen Creek County Island Fire District within the Town's municipal planning area to provide aid to adjacent neighborhoods and communities.
- Updated language to reference the announcement of LG Energy Solutions and support mechanisms for local governments to receive up to 80% reimbursement of public infrastructure from advanced manufacturers' share of the state construction sales tax.











Major Changes from 2023 (continued)

- Updated language to reflect that Proposition 400 extension is currently on the ballot.
- Added support to seek relief in the event the requested tax refunds, plus interest, as a result of the invalidation of the Pinal Regional Transportation Authority tax, exceed the available escrow balance.
- Added language that supports legislative efforts that contribute to the goals of an alternative designation, reduce costs to the taxpayers for participation and would allow CAGRD member lands to remain member lands.
- Prepared language updates to modernize legislative terminology and reflect the current state of affairs of issues.
